It was a course full of wonderful resources that are accessible in a lot of communities as well as across BC and the facilitators were very knowledgeable and themselves play a vital role in mental health awareness. I feel that I gained a wonderful amount of knowledge to do with a large range or mental health diagnosis, as well as how and why mental health care not only is so important to us individually but to our society as well. We also were taught (and were given), how to use a naloxone kit. I feel any course and availability to any info towards mental health is a necessity in our society today and would recommend this course to everyone. I appreciate it so much that our union gives its members the availability to learn so many different topics.

Bargaining-


