#### Local Bylaws, Section 4, d):

Out of town mileage for use of a personal vehicle to attend General or Special Meetings shall be allowed on a capacity/occupancy ratio of 1:3 (1 person in vehicle = 1/3, 2 persons in vehicle = 2/3, 3 or more people in vehicle = 3/3) of the mileage rate as is applicable under the CUPE BC Expense Policy.

Seven members of our local attended the National Convention in Vancouver this month. Between the run for National President and the contentious resolutions brought to the floor regarding strike pay, it was a busy week. CUPE Ontario president Fred Hahn and CUPE BC President Mark Hancock ran for the vacant position of National President when Paul Moist announced his resignation earlier this month. It was a clean and well run campaign on both sides and Mark Hancock narrowly won the seat. Consequently Paul Faoro will be performing the duties of BC President until elections can be held in April. There were many great speakers including Mohammed Fauhmy, the Al Jezeera journalist imprisoned in Egypt, Justice Sinclair from the Reconciliation hearings, Stephen Lewis who spoke on the Leap Manifesto, and Tom Mulcair who was in Vancouver for the NDP convention. The speakers were inspiring and energized the crowd. Much chanting, clapping and pounding of tables was heard in appreciation of the work that others are doing around the world. It was awesome to be reminded that we are so much bigger than our little local here in the Valley. There is much to be thankful for here but so much work to do to maintain what we have gained and to help others attain their goals as well.
