

Aboriginal Education in SD67

On April 13, 2015, was an important day for Aboriginal Education in School District 67, as their local Enhancement Agreement was signed. This document, which will be in effect until 2020, sets out the goals for Aboriginal Education within the District. It is a collaborative effort of a number of groups, including the school district, all the local Aboriginal communities, and the Ministry of Education. The four goals for 67 are represented by the Four Food Chiefs, a Syilx (Okanagan) oral story.



Goal 1 (Black Bear): To raise awareness and understanding of Aboriginal history, traditions, and culture for all students and staff in the Okanagan Skaha School District.

Goal 2 (Saskatoon Berry): To increase Aboriginal student's sense of belonging, including sense of place, personal and cultural identity, and self-esteem in a caring, safe and inclusive environment.

Goal 3 (Speetlum): To nurture and foster relationships between the Okanagan Skaha School District and Aboriginal families, communities, and organizations.

Goal 4 (Spring Salmon): To increase the educational success of all Aboriginal students.

The principal of Aboriginal Education for 67, Anne Tenning, asked me to participate and sign the document on behalf of CUPE. This was truly an honour, as I also am a member of the Aboriginal Education team.

Here is an excerpt from my speech:

"Since its inception just over fifty years ago, CUPE has been committed to equality, justice, full inclusion and the right to self-government for all First Nations, Metis, and Inuit peoples. Our current national president, Paul



Moist, has said: "We must all learn of Indigenous peoples' history when we seek to understand and address the persisting injustices faced by them."

After asking my fellow CUPE ABED EAs to stand with me, I said: "Ladies and Gentlemen, these are the Education Assistants who work in the Aboriginal Education program, here in School District 67, under the direction and leadership of the amazing Anne Tenning.

Together, we are a team that is privileged to work with and support Aboriginal students.

Together, we offer academic support and cultural opportunities to the very children addressed in this document which we will sign today.


Together, we will do our utmost to follow the mandate in this document and to help to make a better educational environment for our students. This is our passion and this is our promise.
